Dress Code

The required dress code contributes to Higley Traditional Academy's academic environment. Just as dress codes address professional standards in the workplace, HTA's dress code promotes the purpose of academics. It is both the parents' and the child's responsibility to ensure compliance with these standards. **HTA's mandatory dress code options are as follows:**

Monday- Thursday

- Khaki, navy **pants or capris, fingertip length skirts, fingertip length shorts, or fingertip length jumpers and/or dresses.** Shorts must be worn under skirts, jumper/dresses but not visible.
- Jeans, fingertip length jean skirts or jean shorts are allowed. The jeans must be medium to dark blue with no frays, holes or fading.
- **SHIRTS** - Solid red, white, black, navy or yellow collared shirts with no brand name logos are required and should be tucked in during the school day.
- **LAYERS** – Solid red, white, black, navy or yellow with no brand name logos can be worn under a **COLLARED SHIRT of the SAME COLOR.**
- **SCHOOL LOGO** - collared shirts, sweatshirts and hoodies are allowed.
- **OUTERWEAR** - **Solid** red, white, black, navy or yellow sweatshirts, sweaters and hoodies can be worn with no brand-name logo.
- **FOOTWEAR** is limited to closed-toed shoes or sandals with straps on the heels. Days that students have a PE class, tennis, running, or other athletic shoes are required.
- **Solid** red, white, black, navy, yellow & khaki colored socks, tights or leggings.

- **HAIR** must be of a "**naturally occurring**" color & **hair accessories** must be moderate and school colors. (Solid red, white, black, navy or yellow)

- Jewelry and all additional accessories must be respectful of the learning environment.

- On **Fridays**, students can wear a designated school spirit T-shirt. Otherwise a collared shirt in an approved color is required.

*Consequences for not following the above stated dress code:

1st offense- Conference with student and contact parent

2nd offense- Contact parent; change clothes

3rd offense- Contact parent; change clothes

*Repeated offenses may be considered insubordination which is a violation of the HUSD Code of Conduct. If possible, the health office will provide a change of clothes. In the event a violation is a disruption to the learning environment, a student may be moved to an alternative classroom until a resolution has been reached.

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
