❖ **School Update**

- Staff – still looking to hire a Para II SPED for Ms. Shay Rose’s room
- Enrollment -615 Students -still receiving new students, the house market still very hot, so we have some families moving and new families coming in.

❖ **COVID-19 Update**

- Mitigation Procedure -District continues to support us by providing some supplies like wipes, Peroxide disinfectant, microfiber cloths, and so on. We still are not doing assemblies as a whole school (District wide), students go straight to class in the morning (District wide), changes have been done to lunches so only one grade at a time is in the cafeteria.
